MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners:

This past Monday afternoon, after I came back to St. Andrew following a long day working at the Chancery, I changed my clothes and took my dog Mabel outside on the deck of the rectory. It was about 5:00 p.m., and it was a beautiful October day. The sun was getting low in the west and shone through the tree branches. As I sat there, I glanced over at Mabel, who was contentedly snoozing away in the sunshine. I immediately had a flashback of a memory. Years ago (probably in the 1980s) I was driving with my mother on the highway north of Ada on an Autumn Day. We passed a house in the country and there was an old dog laying in the driveway sleeping in the sunshine. My mother commented about it, saying how she felt like that old dog was trying to warm its bones before the winter chill set in. I remember that moment whenever I see a dog sleeping in the sun. It is a poignant reminder that the days are short, winter is coming, and the sunshine and blue skies of October will soon give way to the darkness and cold of November.

Mabel will be 13 in January, so she certainly qualifies as an “old dog,” and she seemed to be enjoying this fading opportunity to soak in the sun’s warmth! This coming week is the last week of October. Next Sunday is Halloween. The Sunday after that (November 7) daylight saving time ends, we move our clocks back an hour, and it will be dark early in the evening. So, my message to you this week is, let an old dog teach you something. Take advantage of the beauty and warmth of these last days of October! Soak up the sunshine while you can!

May God bless you all in these beautiful Autumn days.

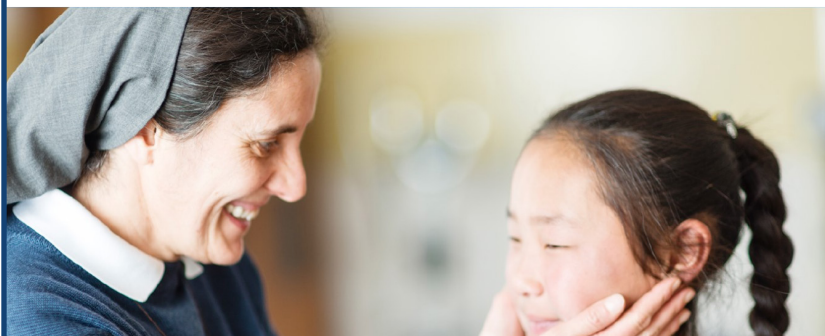

THOUGHTS FOR OUR PARISH CHILDREN

by "Jackie," Fr. Ferguson's Cat



Hi boys and girls! My name is "Jackie," and, as you know, I am Father Ferguson's cat! When I was meowing to you last week, I asked you to think about all the various parts of your Body, and how they allow your Soul to express itself. Your Body is pretty amazing! What were some cool things you got to do this past week through your Body?

You know, the Body is so important that even God came into this world in a Body: that's who Jesus is! Jesus has a Body just like you! And Jesus did a lot of things with His Body to express His Soul – especially the love and mercy and kindness that His Soul desires to give to everyone. When you think back on your favorite Bible stories, what are some of the things Jesus did with His Body?

You might need to help me. As a cat, I'm afraid that I was caught napping a few times when Father was trying to read Bible stories to me when I was a kitten. 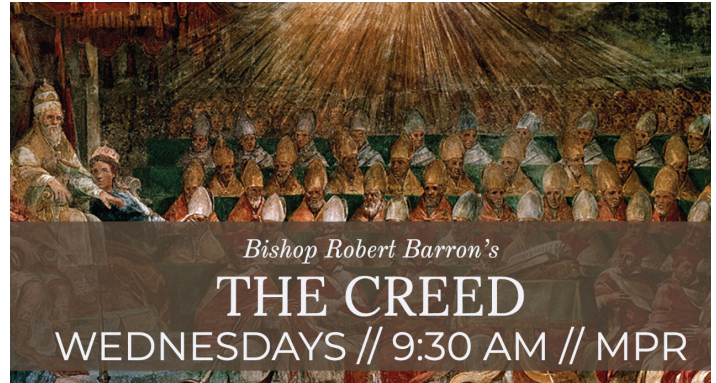

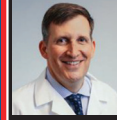

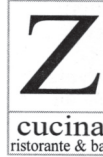
