MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the First Sunday of Lent. We have begun our Lenten journey from ashes to Easter, from death to New Life. I hope and pray you will have a holy and fruitful season of penance, and be faithful to this journey of repentance and renewal.

On this First Sunday of Lent, our catechumens will be enrolled among "the Elect" in the Rite of Election celebrated by Bishop Fernandes. "Elect" means they have been chosen to receive the Sacraments of Initiation – Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist – at the Easter Vigil. Congratulations to all of our RCIA class!

This coming Friday, March 3, St. Andrew Parish will have a Lenten Fish Dinner. I am very pleased that a group of brave parishioners have stepped up to revive this Lenten tradition in our parish after having disappeared for a few years. A second opportunity will take place on Friday, March 31, also. I thank those who are leading this effort and I pray for a great success!

On Sunday, March 5, Bishop Fernandes will be present here at St. Andrew Parish to administer the Sacrament of Confirmation to our eighth-grade Confirmation class. The Confirmation Mass will take place at 3:00 p.m. Our confirmation candidates are ready and eager to receive this important sacrament in which they receive the fullness of the gifts of the Holy Spirit to help them to be loyal and faithful disciples of Jesus and witnesses to his Gospel. I know that our candidates are wellprepared and sincere in their desire for the sacrament, because they tell me so. Each candidate writes me a letter in which he or she tells me the reasons they want to be confirmed as well as why their faith is important to them. They may tell me about the saint whose name they have chosen for confirmation, and how they will model their lives after their chosen saint, and seek their intercession. I read all of the letters the confirmation candidates write to me, and I am always inspired by their faith and trust in God. Many of them relate how their faith has helped them through difficult times. I pray for our confirmands that their faith may always grow stronger!


I wish all of you a blessed Lenten season! May you all persevere in the pursuit of holiness.

THOUGHTS FOR OUR PARISH CHILDREN

by "Jackie," Fr. Ferguson's Cat

Hi boys and girls! My name is "Jackie," and, as you know, I am Father Ferguson's cat! It's the Season of Lent! That's right! That means we are wanting to practice more than ever how to be holy and how to get ready for Heaven! When you're on a track team, your



teammates cheer you on to stay strong as you strive for the finish line and for victory. In a similar way, our ultimate "teammates" are those who are already at the "finish line" of Heaven. They are called the "saints" and "blesseds." And they want to help you to keep growing strong as holy children of God. During this Season of Lent, I want to meow to you about some of the young saints and blesseds who are in Heaven to cheer you on.

One of them is Blessed Carlo Acutis (meowed "a-COOtis"). He lived in Italy and was born not long ago...in 1991. As a young boy, Blessed Carlo loved going to Mass every day and meeting Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. He would even drag his parents along who, at first, didn't want to go. Carlo also loved computers, and he used his computer skills to design a website that kept track of all the "Eucharistic miracles" around the world. That's when Jesus makes the host at Mass actually LOOK like his real human flesh, which we always know it is anyway, in a sacramental way.

Carlo liked to play video games, but he only did so for one hour per week, because he wanted to keep his focus on Jesus and helping others. He would defend those who were bullied at school. He also loved animals – he had four dogs, and (more importantly) – two cats! When Blessed Carlo Acutis was 15 years old, he got a disease called "leukemia." And even though he was really sick, he knew that God was with him all the time. Blessed Carlo is an example of how young people are called to live totally for Jesus. Why not take a few minutes this week and pray to Blessed Carlo Acutis and ask him for his help to grow stronger in holiness? Have a "purr"-fect week!
