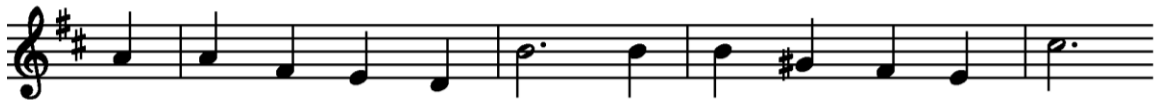
Crown Him with Many Crowns
