

All: And grant us your salvation.


Leader: May almighty God have mercy on us,

We continue with the sung Kyrie, intoned by the cantor:



Forty Days and Forty Nights




- 1. For ty days and for ty nights You were fast ing in the wild;

- 5. Keep, O keep us, Sav-ior dear, Ev er con-stant by your side;




- 1. For ty days and for ty nights Tempt ed, and yet un de-filed.

- 5. That with you we may ap-pear At th'e-ter-nal Eas-ter-tide.












Agnus Dei from Mass XVIII

It is not on bread alone we live, but on every word God speaks. Let us follow where the Spirit leads, let this be our food and drink.


Our hunger is not satisfied by the things we can possess. Let us serve the living God alone; in God alone our rest.
